Bikes



Health and Wellbeing

Illness

We have seen a small rise in the number of children with sickness over the last few weeks. Can we remind parents and carers that if your child is sick or has diarrhoea, they should remain off school for 48 hours to prevent the spread of illness. We have also seen a rise in cases of Covid. There is no need to test your child for Covid but if your child has a temperature or is too unwell to attend school (as with any other illness), please keep them at home until they are well. Due to this, we have revisited hand washing and how important it is to wash our hands thoroughly at all times.
