

Florence trained to be a nurse in Germany.

She worked as a nurse in the Crimean War and helped improve hospitals because they were unhygienic.

Florence got the nickname 'The Lady with the Lamp' because she checked on the soldiers each night with a lamp.

Hospitals today are cleaner, have better equipment and good food because of Florence Nightingale.

Florence was awarded the Royal Red Cross.
